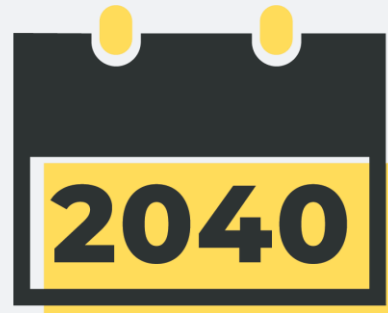

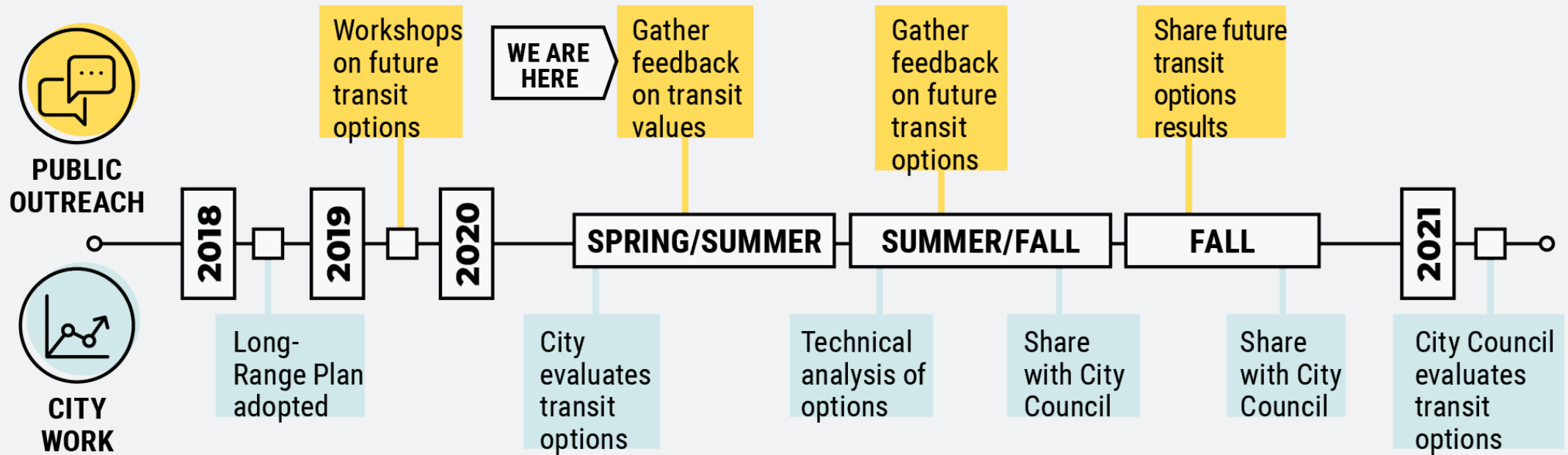

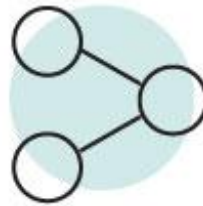

OPTION 1: Growth

- Based on Long-Range Plan goals
- Voter approval required
- Sales tax increase: 0.6% to 0.9%
- Investment in sustainability and improving transit mobility within the city

OPTION 2: Growth through consolidation

- Consolidation of Everett Transit and Snohomish County based system, Community Transit
- Voter approval required
- Sales tax increase: 0.6% to 1.2%
- Investment in improving transit mobility within the city and region

OPTION 3: Current system

- No new revenue invested into transit service
- Sales tax remains at 0.6%
- Evaluate transit service within Everett including routes and frequency



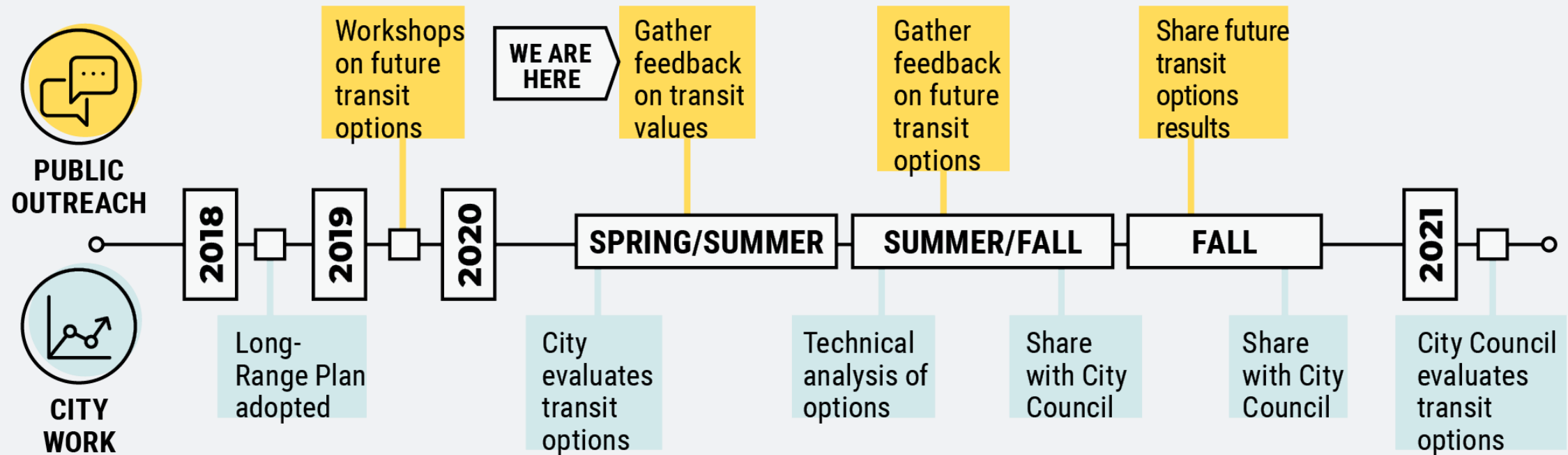
